Reporting directly to the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), the **Housing Initiatives Project Coordinator** is responsible for the day-to-day coordination and implementation of Confederacy of Treaty Six First Nations housing initiatives. This position ensures projects are delivered on time, within scope, and in alignment with Treaty Six values, community priorities, and funding requirements.

- Coordinate housing initiatives from planning through implementation, including work plans, timelines, milestones, and deliverables.
