Health Canada Approves Trial for Potential COVID Vaccine:

On May 16, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau announced that the Canadian Center for Vaccinology at Dalhousie University has been given the green light by the federal health authority to begin clinical trials. Clinical trials generally consist of three phases of studies before a vaccine is approved for general use. These studies often start with a few subjects, before they are broadened to include hundreds or even thousands of subjects. Should the trials be successful and the vaccine approved, the National Research Council of Canada will then work with the developers of the potential vaccine so that it would be able to be manufactured domestically.

Question of the Day

Q: Should individuals receive routinely scheduled immunizations during the COVID-19 pandemic?

A: Immunization is an essential health service. Priority should be given to immunizing infants, toddlers and children who are without symptoms; they should continue to receive scheduled vaccines using the routine Alberta Immunization Schedule. If an adult has no symptoms they can also receive immunizations in the Health Center. Health Centers have adopted a number of basic measures, such as modifying appointment schedules and continuous masking, that decrease the risk of COVID-19 transmission. It is preferable to offer multiple vaccines at the same visit, if indicated, as it will reduce the number of health care encounters. For these individuals, please continue to book appointments through your health center. Centers should designate one day or part of a day for immunizations to reduce risk of transmission. During the COVID-19 pandemic, individuals with any symptoms that could be evidence of COVID-19 infection should postpone immunization appointments until they have recovered. A delay in the routine Immunization Schedule of one or two weeks is acceptable if it will decrease the risk of COVID-19 transmission to the public and healthcare providers. Anyone with suspected, probable, or confirmed COVID-19, and those who are close contacts of a case, should not attend scheduled immunization appointments during their period of isolation.

Canada Child Benefit (CCB) Payment Increase

In addition to the one-time payment of \$300 per child more in the May installment, the CCB will be increased once again in July, to keep up with the costs of living. The increase will be in place for the 2020-21 benefit year, and will raise the maximum benefit to \$6,765 per child under age 6, and \$5,708 per child aged 6 through 17.
